UNIDAD I

Features of connected speech: Gradation. Weak and strong forms of prepositions, pronouns, auxiliary verbs, conjunctions, modal verbs, verb to be.

UNIDAD II

Features of Connected Speech: Elision: Historical and contextual elision within the word and at word boundaries. Elision of vowels and consonants. Vowel reduction. Comparison with the same phenomena in their native language.

UNIDAD III

Features of Connected Speech: Assimilation. Established and colloquial assimilation. Assimilation within words and in context. Coalescence and Compression. Assimilation of voice, point of articulation, manner of articulation Comparison with Spanish criteria.

UNIDAD IV

Features of Connected Speech: Stress: Nature and Quality. Stress in isolated words. Placement of stress. Primary, secondary stress within a word. Complex word stress. Word Origin. Anglosaxon, Latin, French Origins. Suffixes and Prefixes: rules for stress. Recognition. Comparison with Spanish.

Features of Connected Speech: Compounds words. Variable stress (Shifting stress). Even and uneven stress. Sentence Stress. Rhythm. Importance of Stress in meaning. Intonation: General Aspects. Pitch. Voice. Tones. Comparison with the Spanish Criteria.
